PALFINGER P160: GREAT PERFORMANCE IN SMALL SPACES



Werent machines were used on the set of Sophia Loren's latest film "The life ahead". One of the sets selected by the production team was in the old town of Trani. The actress was chosen to star in the film based on the novel of the same name by Romain Gary. Written and directed by her son Edoardo Ponti, the film tells the story of Madame Rosa and her love of tolerance and sharing and will come out in the second half of 2020. Even the "Viva! Festival" has chosen Werent as its partner for the 2020 edition. "Viva!" is an electronic music festival held in Valle d'Itria, organized by the team of the famous festival Club to Club Torino and its lineup presents a similar caliber of intriguing and avantgarde artists from the world of disco, soul, hip-hop, techno, electronic and experimental music.



The Palfinger P160 is a high-performance truck platform. With its articulated arm it is able to reach a working height of 16 meters. The narrow and compact carriage, together with its capacity to stabilize without going out of its frame, makes it a versatile and particularly performing machine even in small spaces.



A CATAMARAN WHICH "SAILS" ALONG THE ROAD

The most "exceptional" transportation, in chronological order, that involved the highly specialized exceptional transport and lifting company MARRAFFA, took place at the beginning of this year in Gallipoli (near Lecce) and saw several company employees involved in the handling of "Utopia", the new maxi catamaran that is set to become the flagship of Escursioni La Torre Vado, a company which deals with maritime tourism and boat rentals, offering boat trips on both the Ionian and the Adriatic sides of the peninsula. The new boat, a "Catmarine 60 Passengers" model, was launched along the north coast of Gallipoli, near the basin of Porto Gaio. The luxurious, 18 m long and 7 m wide vessel, with a tonnage of 35 tons, was built over two and a half years by the team of the Catmarine shipyard in Miggiano (LE) thanks to the employment of workers and designers from the Salento area and the design was entrusted to local professionals. The new catamaran was transported by the Marraffa team from the industrial area of Miggiano to Gallipoli, after a design period of about eight months. "It was a complex activity that required a lot of attention – said Giovanni Marraffa, Project Manager of the company in Martina Franca – considering the volume of the cargo. Our technical office was responsible for the meticulous planning, which was reflected in the subsequent implementation". An "exceptional" professional. Marraffa's business, therefore,



consists in the supply exceptional of transport, national transport and crane services, aimed at all kinds of activities. The Apulian company has been operating for about 30 years using highly specialized personnel with which it has consolidated its position in the Italian and European transport sector.



Michele Marraffa, founder of the company and still its director, has built up a strong organization – which has now become a point of reference in the sector – on the basis of his working experience in the handling sector in the widest sense of the term. Around him he has been able to create a group of people with whom new challenges are faced on a daily basis; challenges that their sound, continually updated professional experience allows them to face. The launch took place along the north coast of Gallipoli, at the De Santis dock, which lies near the Porto Gaio basin; the maxi catamaran was therefore transported from the Miggiano industrial area and escorted using special vehicles, to Gallipoli. This was the most "exceptional" transport ever performed on public roads in the lower Salento: for this reason it was carried out with extreme caution along approximately 70 km of the planned route, on a 46 m long convoy, heading north from Miggiano towards the Lecce-Leuca road and then joining up with the Lecce-Gallipoli (along the route dozens of road signs had to be removed and then reassembled). Two 250-ton cranes were used to lift the maxi catamaran, and several vehicles were also involved as safety cars.

Between the end of 2019 and the first months of 2020, MARRAFFA, a leading company in the field of exceptional transport and lifting, was the protagonist of some of the most complex exceptional transports realized in the whole of Italy.

The MARRAFFA team was also involved in the removal of a block of radioactive waste that had been buried for half a century in the "Irreversible Pit 7.1" of the Enea research centre in the district of Trisaia, in the municipality of Rotondella, in the province of Matera. The "giant" 54-cubic-metre mass was buried at a depth of 6.5 metres. It was a 130-ton block of cement, divided into four parts, which needed 6 days of crane manoeuvres to close the seven-and-ahalf year old construction site necessary to complete the removal of the monolith.

Another activity of which Managing Director Michele Marraffa's company is particularly proud is one carried out in Foggia, at the Istituto Poligrafico e Zecca dello Stato for the realization of a Green Data Center. The new plant houses the necessary equipment to ensure operational continuity including IT Disaster Recovery services provided by the Poligrafico dello Stato. This is the first construction of its kind in Italy, in which the Marraffa team was happy to give its assistance for the building project. In Cellino San Marco, land of good wine, MARRAFFA was involved in the complex operations necessary to transfer 12 wine tanks of one of the most important wineries in the Salento area. The handling operations consisted in moving them from the old headquarters to the new location of the winery. Two cranes at the start took care of the shooting to put each mega load placed later on a self-propelled SPMT for transportation to the new site. On arrival, two other cranes carried out the verticalisation of the tanks.

TWO AXLES FOR LIFTING 90 TONS: THE TEREX RT 90 RENTABLE WITHOUT AN OPERATOR



The Bronto S 70 XR is a high-performance machine. With a horizontal reach of up to 37 metres and a working height of up to 70 metres, it is a machine that specialises in lifting personnel, while maintaining the highest safety standards, also thanks to its nacelle which is capable of rotating up to 180 degrees. The S 70 XR is not characterized as exceptional transport, in fact the machine does not

require any special exceptional transport permits to travel by road. Its radio control function allows the operator to handle the vehicle without necessarily being in the cabin.



A 47-metre-high machine with another 17 metres available if you use the jib, offering a total height of 64 metres.

This is the Terex RT 90 that WERENT offers in its vehicle fleet, and it is available for rental without an operator. A unique vehicle for its kind, having 2 axles and being only 3

meters wide, but above all because it is capable of lifting up to 90 tons.
